THE BROWN ARCHIVE: BEECHCRAFT D-18S N43927



The Beechcraft Model 18 [Twin Beech] is a 6 to 11 seat, twin engine, low wing, tail dragger manufactured by the Beech Aircraft Corporation of Wichita, Kansas. It was continuously produced from 1937 to November 1969 [over 32 years - a world record at the time] with over 9,000 being manufactured making it one of the world's most widely used light aircraft. It was sold worldwide as a civilian executive, utility, cargo aircraft and passenger airliner on tailwheels, nosewheels, skis or floats and was extensively used as a military aircraft.



I took these pictures of the Beechcraft at Omaka, where the aircraft is at present based, in March last year [2024]. This particular aircraft was built in 1945, being a very sought after model with eight passenger seats and reputedly being one of the best equipped Beech 18's in the world. It is one of the first post WW II variants with 1,035 being built.

With its twin-tailfin configuration the Model 18 often is mistaken for the larger Lockheed Electra series of airliners.

A Beechcraft AT-11 Kansan [ZK-AHO] ex USAAF manufactured in 1943 is at present on display at MOTAT in Auckland. This particular aircraft was used by Piet van Asch's company "NZ Aerial Mapping" for 37 years and together with the General Aircraft Monospar [ZK-AFF], photographed much of NZ. This aircraft was retired in 1980 and donated to MOTAT in 1982.
